# RIL signs MoU to invest ₹65K cr in AP

Plans to set up 500 compressed biogas plants; agreement signed in presence of CM Naidu

THE Andhra Pradesh government signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Reliance Industries for the establishment of 500 compressed biogas (CBG) plants with a total investment of around ₹65,000 crore (₹130 crore per plant). All the available wastelands will be utilised for the project. The deal was signed in the presence of Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu at the state secretariat on Tuesday.

The plants would create direct and indirect employment for around 2.50 lakh people with estimated financial benefit of around ₹57,650 crore over a period of 25 years through State Goods and Service Tax collection, electricity duty and taxes on employment.

Terming the MoU a landmark, Naidu in a post on X said, "Out of Reliance's national target of 2,000 CBG plants, 500 state-of-the-art CBG plants will be built throughout Andhra Pradesh over the next three years. This will make our state a frontrunner in clean energy and sustainable development.

With Reliance's commitment to enhancing lives and livelihoods in AP, this partnership will also drive growth across multiple sectors. By attracting such transformative investments, our Integrated Clean Energy Policy is proving instrumental in positioning our state as a preferred destination for industries, a swing in AP's favour."

Stating that Andhra Pradesh would be known as an ideal destination for 'Speed of Doing

Business', he observed that the attractive policies rolled out by the state government has resulted in investor confidence.

Appointing Andhra Pradesh Transmission Corporation Joint Managing Director Keerthi Chekuri as the escort officer for the project, Naidu assured complete support to the company for the quick completion of the project.

In response of Naidu's suggestion to produce gas through

solid wastes, which would be provided by the state government, representatives of Reliance Energy said they will construct the plants viable for production through municipal solid waste.

"We have rolled out Clean Energy Policy 2024 with a target to attract investments to the tune of ₹10 lakh crore. We are also mulling over establishing a clean energy university. Besides solar and wind, we are also looking at pumped storage energy," the Chief Minister explained.

Naidu also lauded Ministers Gottipati Ravi Kumar (Energy) and TG Bharat (Industry) for expeditiously taking decisions regarding the MoU.

Terming the development historic, IT Minister Nara Lokesh highlighted that the MoU was signed in just 30 days of his meeting with Reliance Industries chairman Mukesh Ambani and Reliance Energy director Anant Ambani in Mumbai.

"This will invigorate the policies of Speed of Doing Business that are being implemented in the state," Lokesh said.

# HC QUASHES CASE UNDER WAQF ACT

The Kerala High Court has quashed a case registered against two former postal department officers on a complaint by the Waqf Board that they illegally took possession of Waqf property on which a post office was located. The officials had not obtained its sanction, the board alleged.

THE DMK, whose leaders are known for their 'gift of the gab', seems to be upping its game as the party has handpicked and groomed 182 young orators to campaign for the party in the 2026 Assembly elections. These speakers have been selected after multi-level competitions and training camps from a total of 17,000 aspirants.

Since its initial days, DMK grew in Tamil soil through its leaders' speeches and writings. Many of its leaders were fiery orators who could captivate the masses through their literary and emotional oration. DMK founder CN Annadurai described EVR Periyar's public meetings as "Tamil Nadu's first evening colleges". Late DMK leader K Anbazhagan, in a book, equated 'speech' to 'service' (thodu).

To reclaim the party's peerless distinction in public speaking, DMK president and Chief Minister M K Stalin tasked deputy CM and youth wing secretary Udhayanidhi Stalin



to infuse fresh blood into the party by identifying 100 young orators. Since last June, DMK youth wing functionaries have been reaching out to colleges for their Kalaigalar Karunanidhi centenary speech competition titled "En Uyirinum Melana" — the Tamil words with which the late Dravidian leader used to begin his speeches. DMK youth wing state deputy secretary S Joel said 85 judges at the district-level selected 913 orators, who attended training camps that featured classes from Dravidian ideologues and

renowned orators, and received books to read. The 913 contestants received a cash prize of ₹10,000 each.

After the training camps, 182 orators were selected for the state-level competition held on October 26 in Chennai. The next day, Stalin distributed ₹3 lakh, ₹2 lakh and ₹1 lakh cash prizes to the top three orators.

Nanjil Sampath, a popular orator, said, "As far as I know, no political party in India has organised an orator selection of this size in one go. At a time when public stage speaking in Tamil is facing a crisis, the DMK has rejuvenated it with a force of 182 speakers, providing them the status of headquarters orators. I am sure they will play a significant role in DMK's win in 2026 elections."

These orators will propagate the Dravidian ideology, principles and the DMK government's achievements in public meetings, especially in rural areas.

# Low pressure weakens, but heavy rainfall in TN likely to continue

THE Regional Meteorological Centre (RMC) said on Tuesday that the low-pressure area lying over the Southwest Bay of Bengal, off North Tamil Nadu and adjoining South Andhra Pradesh coasts, is weak and unlikely to develop into a depression.

However, heavy rains are expected in the north coastal districts, southern districts, and western ghats districts over the next four days.

In the last 24 hours, heavy rainfall was recorded at isolated places in the state. Perungudi in Chennai recorded the highest rainfall of 8cm in 24 hours ending at 8.30 am on Tuesday. Alandur, Meenamakkam, Adyar, Alandur and YMCA Nandanam in Chennai recorded 6cm each during the same period. From October 1 till date, Tamil Nadu and Puducherry region have received 256 cm of rainfall, which is 1% lower than the usual 259 cm.

According to official forecast, heavy rain is likely to occur at isolated places in Chennai,

# SC rejects review plea on Sterlite plant shutdown

IN a setback to Vedanta Group, the Supreme Court has rejected the review petition filed by the company challenging the order passed by the court in February upholding the Madras High Court's decision to close the Sterlite plant at Thoothukudi in Tamil Nadu.

A three-judge bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud (who has since demitted office) had passed the order on October 22 and the judgment copy has been uploaded recently. The only legal recourse now left for the company is to file a curative petition before the apex court.

The apex court did not find any ground to review its earlier order. "Application for listing the review petition in open court is rejected. Delay condoned.

Repeated breaches from Vedanta's side, says SC

On February 29 this year, the Supreme Court had rejected Vedanta's petition challenging the Madras High Court order of closing of the plant in Thoothukudi in Tamil Nadu. Vedanta had then moved the apex court challenging that order and requested for a review of it. The top court, in its February, order noted that there are "repeated breaches" and "serious violations" on the part of Vedanta in the case.

The SC had also had rejected the appeals filed by Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (TNPCB) challenging the observations made by the Madras High Court against it in connection with

its inaction in the case.

"We are of the view that the HC was justified in making those observations in regard to the lack of alacrity on the part of the TNPCB in discharging its duties," the SC had said.

While rejecting Vedanta's appeal for opening the plant, the SC said, "We are conscious of the nature of contribution of the company to the area. However, court said we have to be mindful of principle of sustainable development, and health and welfare of the residents of the area is a matter of utmost concern".

Listing out the reasons for the dismissal of the appeal, the Apex Court said that Vedanta failed to remove copper slag at almost 11 sites including private land. It also failed to abide by conditions in consent to operate in case of gypsum. Vedanta also failed to obtain authorisation for disposal of hazardous waste, the court said.

# Absence of sperm no innocence in rape cases: Court

MAKING it clear that absence of sperm does not automatically mean innocence in rape cases, a fast track court for Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012 (POCSO) cases here has sentenced an accused to life in prison.

The court's observation on Monday came after the Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) found no evidence of sexual assault against a 17-year-old survivor.

The case pertains to a missing person complaint registered with the LB Nagar police in 2018. Four days later, the police found the girl at Secunderabad Railway station. She told the police that the accused, identified as Kanakala Rajesh, took her to Visakhapatnam under false pretences and assaulted her.

The police registered a case, sent the girl for medical examination and the samples collected were sent to FSL. The FSL report said there was no evidence of sexual intercourse. However, the court observed that forensic evidence like presence of sperm was only just one type of evidence.

# One km-long British-era mining tunnel unearthed in Ballari forest

A team of experts involved in tracing early human habitations in the forests of Sandur in Ballari district recently stumbled upon a 200-year-old one-km tunnel of the British era.

There are many big and small caves in the forests of Sandur and the team launched its study sometime ago. The team led by Prof Ravi Korishettar, honorary director of Archeological Pre-History Museum, and noted wildlife experts Samad Kot-

tur and Santosh Martin from Ballari discovered the tunnel.

The team is assisted by officials from the forest department. Local forest guards were aware of an opening of a tunnel-like structure, but did not venture into it.

On Sunday, the team managed to cover about 100 metres inside the tunnel. As one proceeds, the height of the tunnel decreases, it is close to 4 feet at some places. There is a large opening at the entrance to the tunnel, which resembles a cave.

Study needed

"Not much information is available locally on the tunnel atop the Devadari Hills. It's possible that it was made during the British regime to explore iron ore. Experts in the mining field may throw more light on it," said a team of experts.
